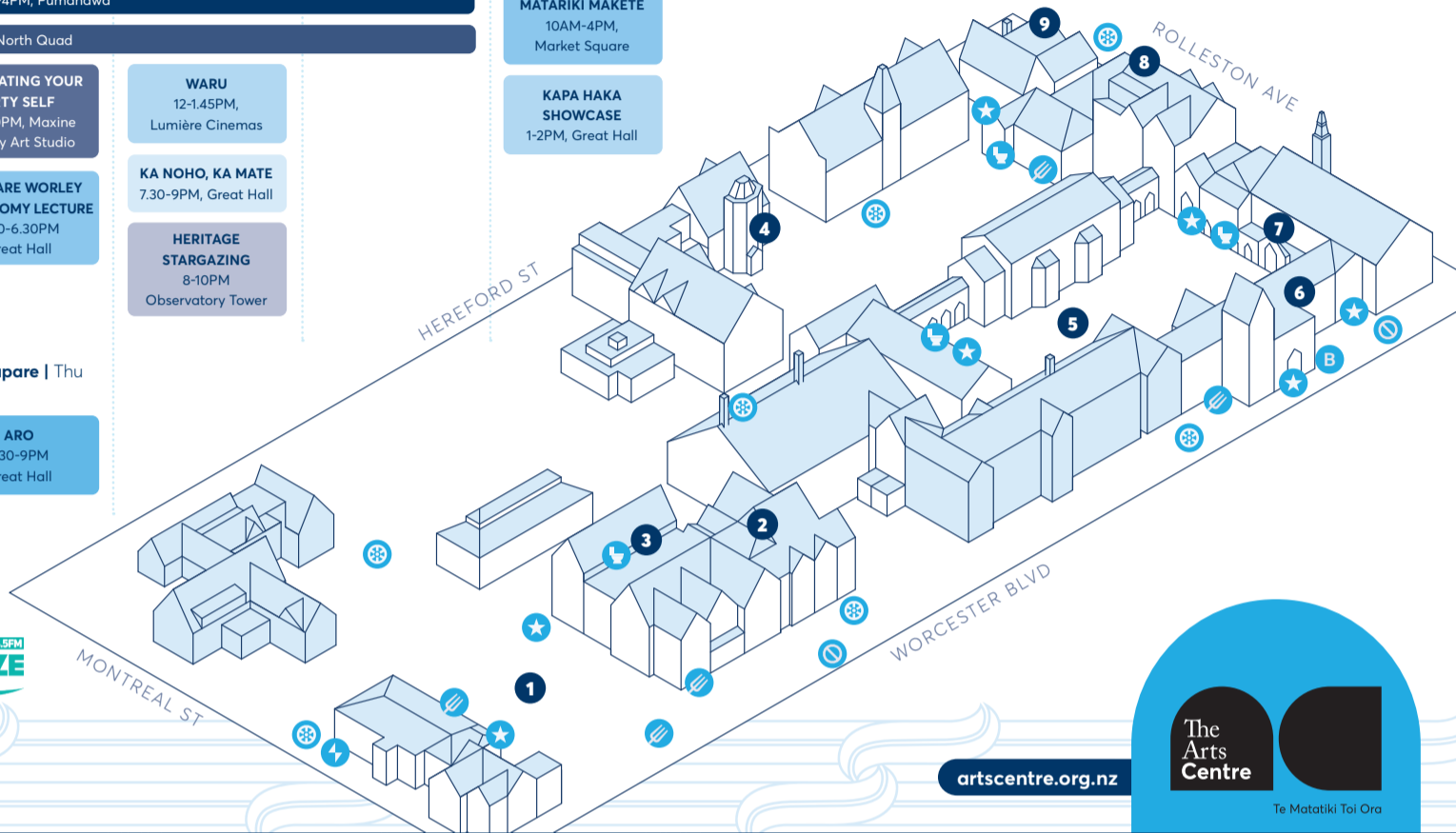

Learn about Micronesian stick charts and create your own traditional navigation chart to take home and hang on your wall. Suitable for ages 5-12.

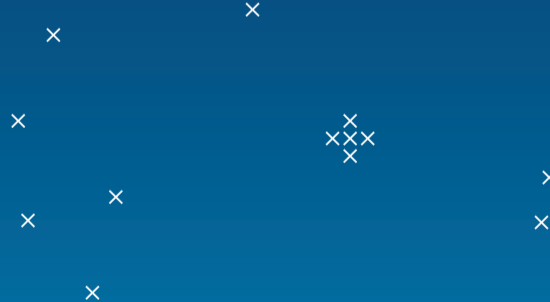


KITE-MAKING (MANU TUKUTUKU)

For mana whenua Ngāi Tūāhuriri, Matariki is an important time. This is the time when whānau ensure their pātaka (food storehouses) are full, and for them to reflect and plan how the land and waterways should be nurtured and prepared to ensure a bountiful and sustainable harvest season.

Matariki is a time for remembering those that have passed during the year and celebrating new life. Pōhutukawa is the star connected to those that have passed on. The star named Matariki signifies reflection, hope, our connection to the environment, and the gathering of people. It is connected to health and well-being.
